ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR ART SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS PROGRAM

TO: Maui County High School Art Teachers and Counselors:

Art Maui is very pleased to announce a reinstated High School Senior Art Scholarship Awards Program to culminate during Art Maui 2012. **High school seniors** attending your school or are **home-schooled** are invited to participate. Please distribute this information to your students and post this letter in areas where art students will see it. We thank you very much for your help with this program, and hope your students will take advantage of these possible art scholarships to the college of the students' choice.

RECEIVING OF ENTRIES: MARCH 15, 2012 – 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. ONLY AT THE SCHAEFER INTERNATIONAL GALLERY AT MACC.

Each participating high school senior may drop off one portfolio of their artwork at this time. The portfolio may contain artwork in painting, drawing, photography, mixed media, small sculpture, ceramics and other small work in 3-dimensions.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS WILL BE GIVEN ON APRIL 14, 2012, AT THE JUROR'S WALK-THROUGH FOR ART MAUI 2012. THERE WILL BE THREE \$2,500 AWARDS GIVEN, WHICH WILL BE FORWARDED TO THE ADMISSIONS OFFICES OF THE SCHOOLS OF THE STUDENTS' CHOICE AT THE APPROPRIATE TIME.

Please read the Rules and Conditions carefully for details:

RULES AND CONDITIONS:

1. All entries must be original and not copies from other artwork of any kind.
2. Artwork must have been produced during the 2011-2012 school year.
3. Each student will be limited to a total of 10 artworks in any combination of 2D or 3D.
4. Entries may be in any medium.
5. Students should submit a portfolio containing a representative selection of their work which indicates a serious interest in art as a profession. Originality, creativity, quality and range, as well as technical achievement and presentation will be considered.
6. Should the student wish to indicate a personal focus or area of concentration, 5 of the 10 portfolio entries should demonstrate that interest as a body of related works. The remaining 5 entries should demonstrate the student's breadth of experience in other media.
7. Entrants should include a brief statement of objectives and aspirations, as well as the name of the college or school where they hope to continue their studies. Teachers may also write letters of recommendation.

8. All 2/D entries must be matted or mounted with white or off-white construction paper, matboard or oak tagboard.
9. Matted size should not exceed 36" x 36".
10. Artwork must be labeled with the following typed information: title, medium, name of student, student's address, phone number, email address, school, and teacher. For 2D entries, attach label to lower right corner of mat on the back. 3-D entries, attach label to a 3x5 notecard on string fastened to entry. Also, write student's name and school on masking tape attached to bottom of all 3/D artworks.
11. All participants enter at their own risk. Art Maui will not assume responsibility for loss or damage to artwork.
12. 3/D artwork must be protected in packing material when submitted.
13. Artwork must be brought to Receiving Day for Art Maui on March 15, 2012, between the hours of 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. (ONLY) at the Schaefer International Gallery at the Maui Arts & Cultural Center at One Cameron Way in Kahului.
14. Artwork from Moloka'i or Lana'i can be mailed if necessary. Please email us about shipping arrangements or questions to Janet Allan (allans@hawaii.rr.com) at least one week prior to shipment. Artwork must reach Maui by Friday, March 14, 2012. Artists or school are responsible for return postage.
15. The portfolio will remain with Art Maui until the Awards Ceremony at the Juror's Walk through on April 14, 2012. All portfolios and artwork entered will be returned to students after the Awards Ceremony, or may be picked up at Art Maui the next day, Sunday, April 15, between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m.
16. Entrants and their families are invited to attend the Juror's Walk-through at 2 p.m. on Saturday, April 14. The Scholarship Awards will be presented following the Walk-through in the Alexa Higashi Meeting Room, where a selection of the winning students' artwork will be shown.
